

***1514.—Uniform—Royal Cypher.**

(N.L. 1596.—8.6.1923.)

In pursuance of His Majesty's pleasure, the Regulation governing the wearing of the Royal Cypher has been amended to read as follows:—

The Royal Cypher in dull silver is worn on the shoulder cord of the aiguillette, or on both epaulettes, or on both shoulder straps of the great coat, watch coat and all white uniform. It is placed immediately below the Crown when worn on the epaulette and when worn on the shoulder strap of an Officer of Flag rank; and covering the two lowest rows of lace on the shoulder strap of other Officers, the bottom of the Cypher being even with the lower edge of the lowest row of lace.
