## (U)†739.—Uniform—Chief Petty Officers and Royal Marines Senior Non-Commissioned Officers—Evening Rig

(N/V3A/125/23/64—27 May 1966)

- 1. Her Majesty The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the introduction of evening rigs for wear by Chief Petty Officers and Royal Marines Senior Non-Commissioned Officers in temperate climates.
- 2. Briefly, the arrangements are that CPOs will be permitted to wear optionally a blue mess jacket and RMSNCOs a scarlet mess jacket, similar in design to the equivalent officers' patterns under the same general conditions now applied to the wearing of white mess jackets abroad. Full details are given in the Annex to this Instruction.
- 3. The Uniform Regulations will be amended.

Shirts either coft white or coft with Morcella front and

Collars, soft turned down (to match shirt fronts).

Distinguishing badges are not to be worn except by Master-at-Arms who will wear a gold MAA's badge (in miniature if possible) on the jacket above the buttons.

Badges of rank on right sleeve as follows: RSM's QM's Staff Bandmaster and Bandmaster.—Embroidered gold and scarlet.

Colour Sergeants.—Miniature gold chevrons 2-in wide on scarlet background with small embroidered gold on scarlet crown above.

Sergeants.—Miniature gold chevrons 2-in wide on scarlet background.

Note.—Gold on scarlet King's badge will be worn by entitled SNCOs.

2. Style of Mess Jackets.—Detailed descriptions are:—

Style of Mess Jackets.—Diagonal blue worsted serge with roll collar; single a. Chief Petty Officers.—Diagonal blue worsted serge with roll collar; single Chief Petty Officers.—Diagonal under collar. Jacket fully lined; single breasted with patrol back; melton under collar. Jacket fully lined; black breasted with patrol back, his black breasted with patrol back, his black lining to body, white lining to sleeves; chest padded and quilted. Inside pocket lining to body, white liming to be lining to be lining to body, white liming to be lining to body, white liming to be lining to be line to be line to be line to be lining to be line to b in right forepart. Set-in site button in upper pair; two show buttons in each holes in each front with link button and anchor crested buttons. No client with link button and anchor crested buttons. holes in each front with fine sinch and anchor crested buttons. No shoulder front; all buttons 36 ligne gilt crown and anchor crested buttons. No shoulder front; all buttons 30 light girls strong all buttons 30 light girls strong to be fitted and the jacket to be slightly roached over the hips with peak straps to be fitted and the jacket to be slightly roached over the hips with peak at back.

b. Royal Marines Senior Non-Commissioned Officers.—Scarlet cloth with blue cloth roll collar and facings; set-in sleeves with blue cloth cuffs 35 in deep. Patrol back and under collar of scarlet body cloth. Jacket fully lined; scarlet lining to body and cream lining to sleeves. Chest padded. No shoulder straps, front fasteners, buttonholes or show buttons to be fitted. Jacket to be slightly roached over the hips with a rounded peak at back.

- 3. Occasions for Wear.—The dress is optional. Approval for the wearing of the rig will in every instance be at the discretion of the Commanding Officer or Senior Officer where more than one ship or establishment is concerned. Approval will normally be given only in respect of organised evening social functions taking place in, or sponsored by, HM ships or establishments or in other Service messes and at functions organised by civic authorities for the Services when appropriate.
- 4. Entitlement to Wear.—These dresses may be worn as appropriate by: a. all CPOs;
  - b. all RMSNCOs serving in RM establishments and units; and
  - c. Colour Sergeants and above serving in HM ships and RN establishments.
- 5. Supply arrangements.—The mess jackets will not be available from Service sources.

  CPOs and RMSNICO.—The mess jackets will not be available from Service should CPOs and RMSNCOs who wish to provide themselves with these jackets should purchase them privately. purchase them privately. All the private traders listed in DCI (RN) 1362/65 have been informed of the introduction of the intr informed of the introduction of the dress and are expected to be in a position to supply shortly. The prototype includes shortly. The prototype jacket for RMSNCOs was made by Messrs Hobsons & Sons (London) Ltd. 154/164 Tooler of (London) Ltd, 154/164 Tooley Street, London Bridge, London, S.E.1.

6. Cost.—The price of the mess jackets is expected to be of the order of £10 to £12.
