(U)†82.—Uniform—Royal Marines—Revision of Dress Regulations (V.102/2/64 (Navy).—17 Apr. 1964.)

- 1. A.F.O. 1861/63 announced the introduction of lovat uniform for the Royal Marines and gave details of its provision together with associated items. The wearing of this uniform began in H.M. ships, R.N. establishments and R.M. units in United Kingdom on 1st April, 1964. In due course, as issues are completed, it will be taken into use on appropriate occasions abroad.
- 2. The next issue of the Appendix to the Navy List will include revised dress regulations for the Royal Marines and will cover the new dress. As an interim measure, the revised regulations have been circulated on a limited distribution by the Department of the Commandant General Royal Marines. These regulations give details of alternative orders of dress which may be worn during the transition period mentioned in A.F.O. 1861/63. Lack of uniformity in everyday dress will inevitably have to be accepted during this period. Provision is made, however, in the Dress Regulations for all ranks to be uniformly dressed in blue or lovat uniform when the occasion requires.
