

DEFENCE COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES AGENCY (GERMANY)

In April 2002, 252 Signal Squadron was transferred into the Defence Communication Services Agency (Germany) (DCSA(G)), as a result of the findings of the Headquarters Land Command Establishment Review Process. The full integration into DCSA(G) has now removed the need to maintain the unit title; therefore it was handed back to the Royal Corps of Signals, for safekeeping effective 10th July 2003. Previously, organisational restructuring also saw the final formal closure of No 11 Signals Unit RAF on 1st June 2003, whom then fully incorporated into DCSA(G), forming the now fully integrated Joint Service and Civilian established Agency.

The Defence Communication Services Agency (Germany) (DCSA(G)) was formed on 11th July 2003 following the disbandment of both 11 Signals Unit Royal Air Force and the Army 252 Signal Squadron Royal Corps of Signals. The Germany based Agency element is essentially a one stop shop for all of the requisite customers needs in communication, providing infrastructure information services through Communication Centres located across Germany and the static technical Systems Control Point based in Rheindahlen, supported via a central Regional Operations Centre.
