Description

Best uniforms with medals (white belt & gaiters for JRs) armed as appropriate.

Best uniform with medals no arms.

As for 1B with medals ribbons.

When worn

Occasions of major ceremony.

Ceremonial occasions when arms are not considered appropriate.

Minor ceremonial & duty personnel.

Notes

Female personnel may wear skirts except when carrying a sword/rifle.

Ball dress with white waistcoat (cummerbund for female officers) with miniature medals.

Mess undress worn with cummerbund/miniature medals.

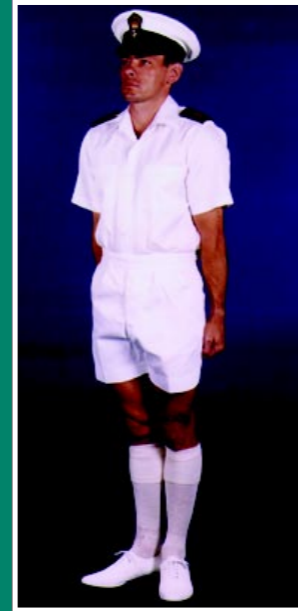
Red sea rig.

Occasions of major ceremony when evening dress is appropriate.

Mess functions.

Informal evening wear in ships and establishments.

Captains (male officers) and above may optionally wear gold laced/plain blue mess trousers. Mess undress optional for WO/SRs. (alternative is No 1CW). Female personnel may optionally wear skirts ashore.



Short sleeve shirt, long white trousers white shoes.

Short sleeve shirt, shorts, shoes & long socks.

Working rig.

Semi formal day rig.

Informal day rig.

Usually only worn at sea.

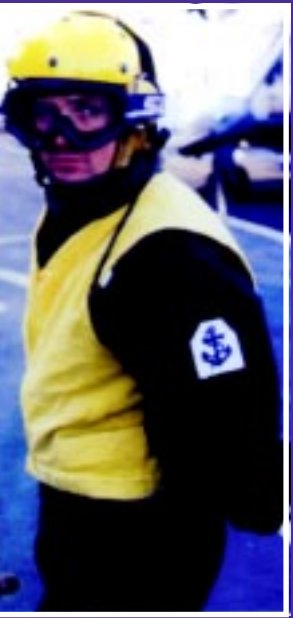
Normal daily Working Rig ashore; may be worn at sea, as directed. Female personnel may optionally wear skirts ashore or white tropical dresses ashore.



Improved Action Working Dress (IAWD) (Fire Retardant).

AWD will be worn as directed and with jersey HW as required.

Collars may be worn up or down as required.
