Clothing, Equipment, &c. for Bandmasters, Royal Marines. G. O. 73.
The uniform dress of Bandmasters of the Corps will
be as follows, viz:-

Full Dress.	{	Cloth Tunic. Tweed Trowsers with Gold Lace Stripe.	
Undress	{	Forage Cap, Officers Pattern. Cloth Frock. Tweed Trowsers with Scarlet superfine Cloth Stripe.	
Appointments &c.	{	Pouch and Belt, Staff Sergts., with Lyre and Crown on the breast. Sword, Scabbard, Belt and Knot, Staff Sergeants. Greatcoat and Cape and Boots, as other Warrant Officers. Gloves, Buckskin.	
2.	The Cloth Tunic to be made up in accordance with the authorized scale, (arm badge, Lyre and Crown.)	<i>Pattern and Badge of Tunic.</i>	
3.	The Frock to be of the same pattern as that authorized for other Warrant Officers, with the exception of the Badge which will be a Crown and Lyre instead of a Crown.	<i>Pattern and Badge of Frock</i>	
4.	A pair of gold, and a pair of scarlet cloth striped trowsers will be issued biennially in alternate years.	<i>Gold and scarlet striped Trowsers.</i>	
5.	The Helmet, Pouch, and Belt, will, when required, be purchased by the Quartermaster, through the Director of Contracts.	<i>Purchase of helmet, pouch and belt.</i>

Appointments &c.	{	Pouch and Belt (over left shoulder) with Lyre and Crown on the breast. Sword and Scabbard, Belt and Knot, Staff Sergts. Boots, Gloves, Greatcoat & Cape, as other Warrant Officers.

6. A Pattern, for style and trimming of Cloth Tunic, has been approved for future guidance, and when required, application for it is to be made to the D. A. General.
7. The Frock is to be of scarlet cloth, No. 1, similar in Pattern to that of other Warrant Officers, but with the addition of white piping down the back seams, to accord with the uniform of the Band (for which $\frac{2}{3}$ yard of white cloth, No. 1 will be allowed,) and a Badge of a Lyre and Crown instead of a Crown, as worn by other Warrant Officers.

8. The Helmet, Pouch and Belt are, when required, to be purchased, as directed in Para. 5.

9. The quantity of gold lace allowed for the Tunic will be as follows :—

Gold Lace $\frac{1}{2}$ inch—1 yd. (for Collar)

,, $\frac{3}{4}$ inch—4 yds. (for Fronts, Cuffs and Back Seams.)

The $\frac{3}{4}$ in. Lace and distinguishing Badge will be specially demanded when required for use.
