Blue Tartan Frock—Warrant Officers and Staff Sergeants.

Warrant Officers and Staff Sergeants may be supplied with an Undress Blue Tartan Frock, similar in pattern to the R.M.L.I. Officers' Blue Serge Frock, in lieu of Serge Tunic, Duck Tunic, or Shirt, the difference between the cost of this frock and the issuing value of any of the articles not taken being charged against them. Description.

Chevrons and badges of rank (gold)—also collar badges for R.M.A.—to be worn, but to be provided separately by the wearers, if they require them (*i.e.*, if they are not already in possession of suitable ones). Chevrons, &c.

These frocks may be worn in offices, and on such other occasions as may be approved by the Colonel Commandant. When worn.

The price of the garment will be published annually. Price.

A sealed pattern Frock is kept at the Chatham Division for general use; when required by another Division or Depôt application should be made to the First Quartermaster, and the pattern returned thither as soon as finished with.
