CIRCULAR.

The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have been pleased to sanction the wearing of a Frock Coat and Sash (Officers' pattern without badges of rank on shoulder strap) by the Divisional Bandmasters R.M.L.I. who are Warrant Officers.

2. A gold lyre and crown is to be worn on the right fore arm, as on the Serge Frock.

3. It is to be distinctly understood that this sanction is a privilege, and the Frock Coat and Sash are not thereby made a Uniform. They are to be worn only when the Bandmaster is conducting the Band at a private engagement and when proceeding directly to and from such engagement. They are never to be worn on duty, nor in Barracks except when proceeding directly to or from private engagements.

4. No expense is to be incurred by the Public in connection with this dress, but Colonels Commandant may arrange for payment of the cost and future upkeep from the Band Fund.
