GENERAL

- 1. The Army Air Corps has now adopted a policy of 2 pilot manning for helicopters, with the consequent reduction of the aircrewman branch. In Royal Marines this will eventually mean the complete demise of Army-trained aircrewman. Current aircrewmen will be given an opportunity be selected for pilot training, normally when on a ground tour, but unsuccessful will remain as aircrewmen until their engagement ends. They we either serve in 3 Commando Brigade Air Squadron RM, or be trained as Na aircrewmen, or serve on a ground tour.
- 2. The Corps still has a requirement for six Naval aircrewmen to serve we 845/846 Naval Air Squadrons. These aircrewmen will also be considered pilot training, but because they do not handle the controls of an aircreduring their training or subsequent service they will be graded in the saway as non-Army aircrewmen trained applicants.
- 3. Officers, warrant officers and non commissioned officers will in future on successful completion of flying training at the Army Air Corps Centricially fly as pilots (P2) with 3 Commando Brigade Air Squadron RM, althous selected officers may undertake RN flying training prior to first tours work Naval Air Squadrons. After a period of continuation training in 3 Command Brigade Air Squadron RM, selected pilots will return to the Army Air Col Centre for an Aircraft Command Course (P1). Successful completion of Aircraft Command Course will qualify the officer, warrant officer or a commissioned officer to command one or more aircraft and operate the aircraft weapons system and observation aids.
- 4. This instruction sets out the rules and procedures relating eligibility, applications for training, selection, flying tours administration of RM (light helicopter) pilots.

ELIGIBILITY FOR PILOT TRAINING

- 5. Officers. All PM officers may apply for training as pilots provided they:
 - a. Are able to start the Army Pilot Course before their 24 birthday.
 - b. Will have completed 2 years commissioned service before starting 1 course.
 - c. Will have extended, or agreed to extend, their service to ensure minimum of 4 years return of service on successful completion of 1 course.
