

193 SPECIALIST QUALIFICATIONS—HEAVY WEAPONS

1. There are three standards for this qualification for the Medium Mortar and the Anti-Tank Gun, and one standard for Guided Weapons.

2. *Heavy Weapons 3rd Class Mortar (HW 3 (MOR))*

Must:—

- a. Be able to operate a 3 inch mortar.
- b. Have a limited knowledge of fire control sufficient to take charge of a 3 inch mortar detachment as an understudy.
- c. Be proficient at map reading and wireless procedure.

3. *Heavy Weapons 3rd Class Anti-Tank (HW 3 (A tk))*

Must:—

- a. Be able to operate an anti-tank gun.
- b. Have a limited knowledge of the Detachment Commander's duties.
- c. Be proficient at map reading and voice procedure.

4. *Heavy Weapons 3rd Class Guided Weapons (HW 3 (GW))*

Must:—

- a. Be able to act as an aimer for the SS 11 missile in the air to ground and ground to ground roles.
- b. Have a limited knowledge of anti-tank tactics.
- c. Be proficient at map reading and voice procedure.
- d. With unit training be capable of manning the 120 mm MOBAT anti-tank gun.

5. *Heavy Weapons 2nd Class Mortar (HW 2 (MOR))*

As for HW 3(MOR) and in addition must:—

- a. Be capable of acting as fire unit commander.
- b. Be capable of exercising trained men on the mortar.
- c. Have a high standard of knowledge of map reading and wireless procedure.

6. *Heavy Weapons 2nd Class Anti-Tank (HW 2 (A tk))*

As for HW 3 (A tk) and in addition must:—

- a. Be capable of commanding a detachment.
- b. Be capable of exercising trained men on the gun.
- c. Have a high standard of knowledge of map reading and wireless procedure.

7. *Heavy Weapons 1st Class Mortar (HW 1 (MOR))*

As for HW 2 (MOR) and in addition must be able:—

- a. To command and control the fire of a medium mortar troop.
- b. To instruct in all aspects of the medium mortar.
- c. To prepare and conduct exercises and field firing.

8. *Heavy Weapons 1st Class Anti-Tank (HW 1 (A tk))*

As for HW 2 (A tk) and in addition must be able:—

- a. To command and control any number of detachments.
- b. To instruct in all aspects of the Anti-Tank Gun.
- c. To prepare and conduct exercises and field firing.
