

197 DRESS—PROVOST SERGEANTS AND UNIT POLICE

1958

Provost Sergeant

The dress of SNCOs appointed for duty as Provost Sergeants in RM units is to include the following special items:—

- (a) *Badge of rank.* Three inverted chevrons to be worn on the right arm below the elbow. On blue and khaki drill tunics the chevrons are to be positioned with the inner angle of the lower chevron one inch above the point of slash; on battledress the bottom point of the lower chevron is to be two inches from the top of the cuff; on the greatcoat, one quarter of an inch above the top of the cuff. In No. 1 and No. 2 dress, chevrons are to be gold on scarlet; in other dresses khaki on khaki or khaki on khaki drill as appropriate.
- (b) *Sword, Staff Sergeant.* To be worn when on duty as Provost Sergeant in all dress other than battledress or its warm weather equivalent, at Commanding Officers discretion.
- (c) *Belt, Sword, Staff Sergeant.* Buff or brown leather to be worn according to the circumstances or conditions, but with the buff belt normally reserved for wear with No. 1 dress.

2 No special issues of chevrons are to be made for this purpose.

3 Swords and buff belts complete are to be issued from pooled resources; brown belts are to be issued under Scale 5 of Uniform Regulations for Non-Commissioned Officers and Men.

Unit Police

4 Ranks employed as Unit Police are to wear, when on duty as police, the white web belt with the white web brace attachment over the right shoulder in all orders of dress. When wearing this dress, SNCOs are not to wear the scarlet sash.
